The *Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act* is a law that protects people who seek help during an overdose. The Act aims to reduce the fear of getting in trouble if police respond to an overdose (even if you have taken a drug or have some on you) and encourages people to help save a life.

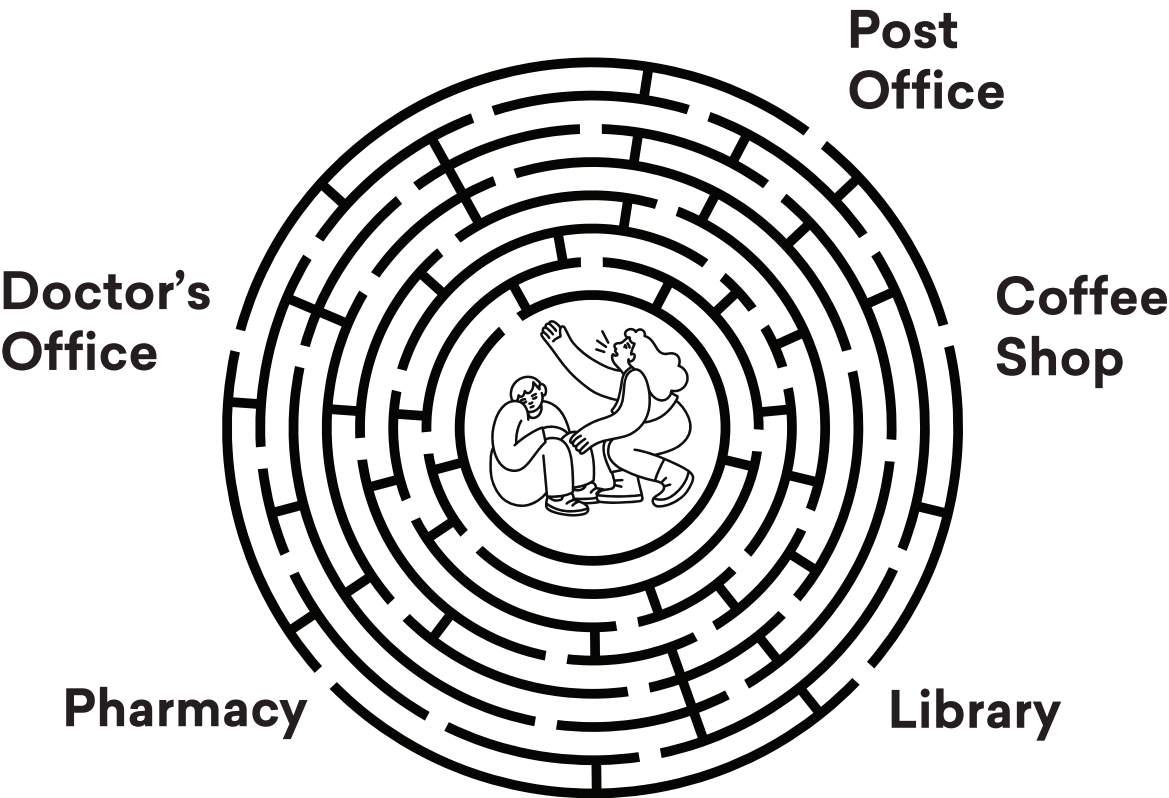

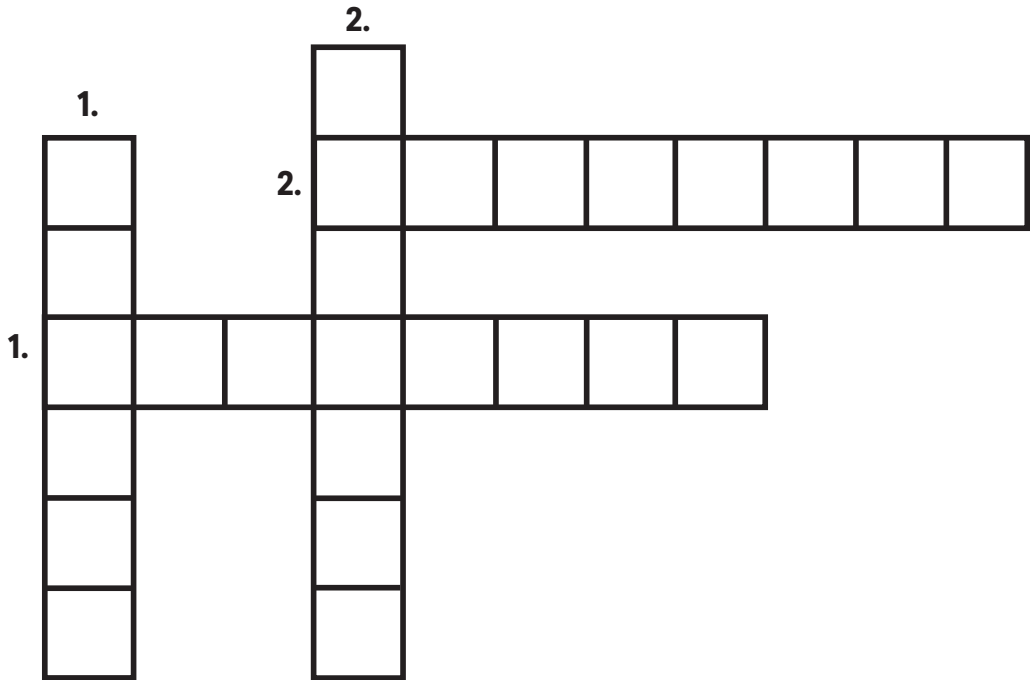
Naloxone is dangerous if not properly administered.
